What is a carer?

A carer is anyone, including children and adults, who looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction and cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid.

Caring can take a variety of forms, such as personal care, practical help with things like shopping or housework, emotional support, or help with managing behaviours or relationships. You don't have to be living with the person you support to be helping to care for them. You could be helping for a few hours a week or supporting them full time.

Register as a carer with your GP.

What is a Carer's Assessment?

Under the Care Act 2014, local authorities have a legal duty to provide adult carers with a Carer's Assessment. The assessment is free and separate from the needs assessment the person you care for might have. It looks at <u>your</u> physical, mental and emotional needs.

Any carer who needs support can have an assessment regardless of the amount or type of care they provide, finances or level of need for support.
