Some people do not show any signs.

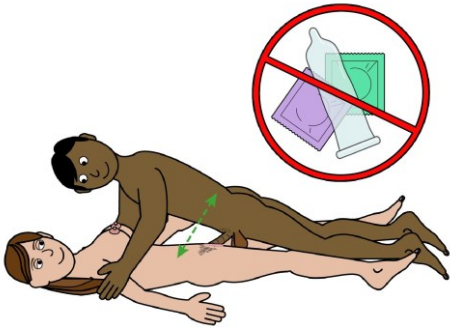

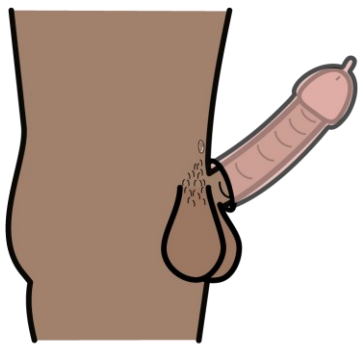
Chlamydia is an infection which one person can give to another through unprotected oral, anal or genital sex.



Men and women can get Chlamydia if you have unprotected sex.



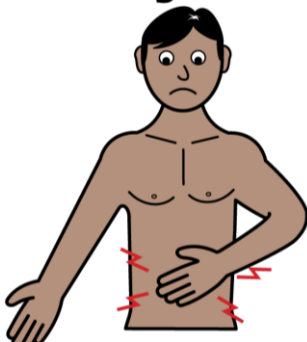
Unprotected sex is when the man or woman doesn't wear a condom.



Using condoms every time you have sex can stop you getting Chlamydia.

Using condoms will also stop you getting other infections too.

Some people with Chlamydia have pain in their tummy below the tummy button.

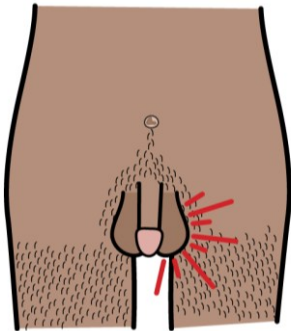


Or pain when peeing.

Or pain in their testicles (balls).

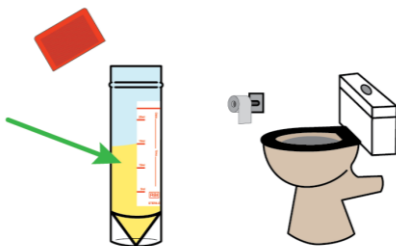
# How do I know if I have Chlamydia?

## urine sample bottle



To find out if you have Chlamydia you need to give a 'urine' or wee sample.

## urine sample



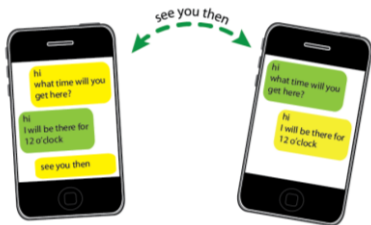
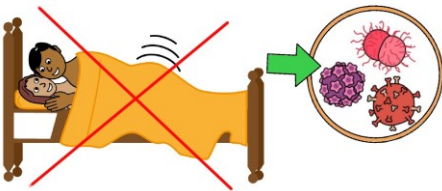
Go to the toilet and pee into the pot.

Screw the lid on firmly.



Leave the sample in the small hatch in the toilet

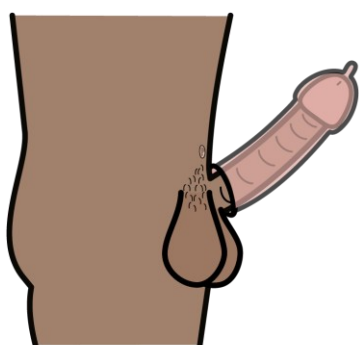

It is important that we know who else you have had sex with.

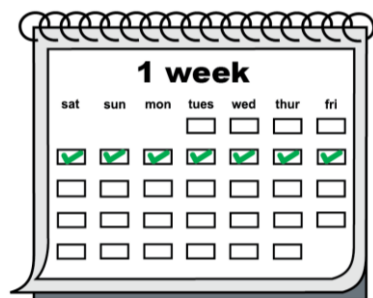
They may need us to help them too.
